Internet Safety Day

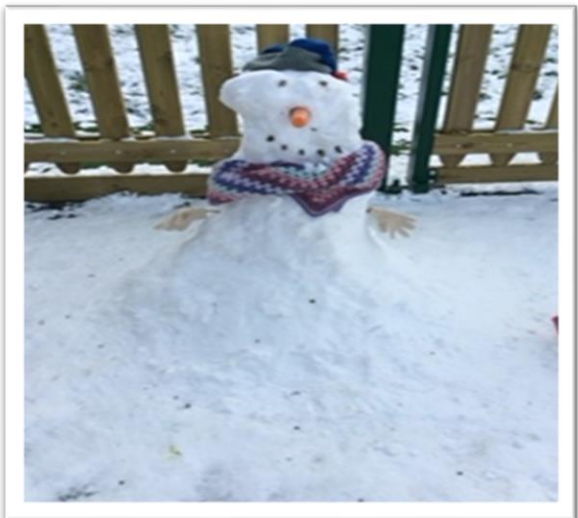

To tie in with 'Take Your Child to the Library Day' and 'Children's Mental Health Week', the Rights Respecting Leaders came up with the proposal of

holding a 'Big Book Swap' and spent the last week campaigning.

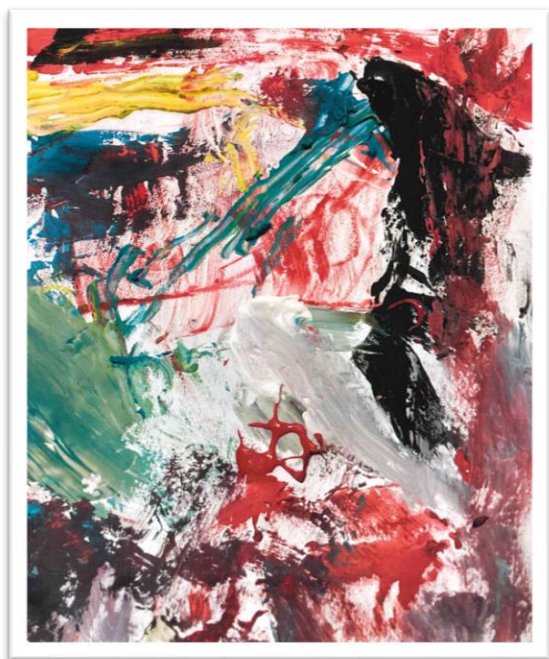
Year 1 Assembly

It's been a very busy school year so far as a parent governor, and this month also marks the end of my second 4 year term as a parent governor at Templemoor Infants and Nursery School. I've represented the parent

community in school governors meeting for 8 years now and in that time, I've witnessed a fair few changes. On a personal note, my eldest has moved from year 1 to year 8 at high school, my middle son has made it through from nursery to year 5 at Moorlands, and my youngest, Isa will be leaving Templemoor this Summer.

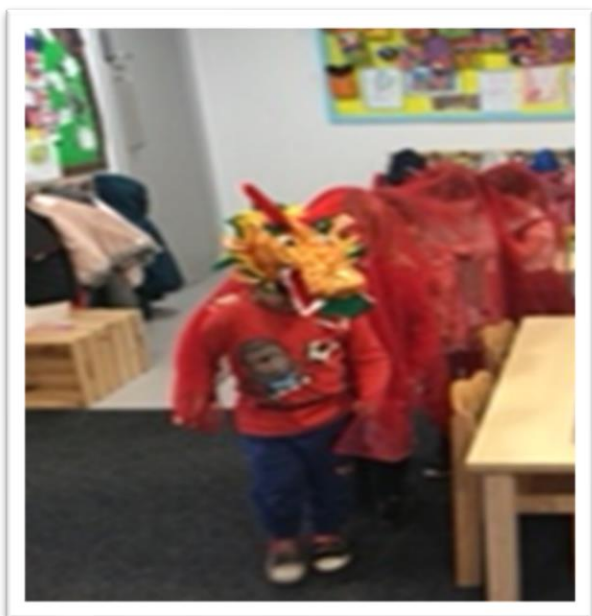
a variety of backgrounds and are incredibly welcoming, so much so that when I first started in the role my youngest was a newborn and he came with me to many of the meetings.

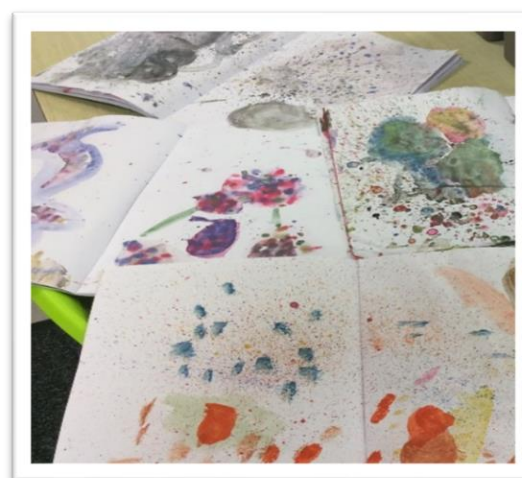
Earrings
