I'm also looking forward to visiting the nursery when we return in November to see how well the


children have settled in and can't wait to see firsthand the enormous range of activities and learning opportunities the nursery staff are providing for the children.

School Outcomes for 2016/17

At the start of our new academic year it is always good to celebrate our children's academic achievements from last year. We now have outcomes from the end of Early Years, the Year 1 Phonic Screening Check and from the end of Year 2. Our performance data is on our website, under the tab 'Our School', 'School Performance'.

As I am sure you will be aware, the national picture for primary schools has changed, and tests and outcomes have significantly raised expectations for children from Year 1 to Year 6. Despite everything being harder, both locally and nationally, our children continue to have excellent outcomes.

Please find attached at the end of this newsletter the full 2017 performance data for Templemoor Infant and Nursery School for the end of Year 2.

School Outcomes for EYFS and Year 1

81.4% of pupils in Reception attained a Good Level of Development against the Early Years framework. The national average is 70.7%, and the Trafford average is 73%. A Good Level of Development is defined as children working at the expected standard or exceeding the expected standard in the key areas of literacy, maths, physical development, communication and language and personal, social and emotional development.

93.3% of children in Year One attained the expected standard in the Phonic Screening test. This is above the national average of 81.2%, and the Trafford average of 83.5%.

Pupil Conferences

This half term every child in Year 1 and Year 2 has had a one-to-one discussion with their class

teacher to discuss progress, attitudes to learning, and to look through their work and to set targets for the next half term. We really do value what your children have to say. They came up with some marvellous suggestions about how they can make their work even better. Well done children. We are so very proud of you!
