Keeping Children Safe in School

The safety and well-being of children is paramount to all that we do at Templemoor. School policies and procedures are in place to ensure that all members of the school community can work together in a way that supports safeguarding for all. There is key member of staff who have responsibility for all safeguarding issues in school. All concerns are reported to the designated Safeguarding lead, Mrs Brown (or Mrs Cundick in her absence). All school staff have a duty to report any concerns that they have or anything brought to their attention by a child or another member of the community. The school also have a safeguarding governor, Mrs Davenport who comes into school regularly to ensure that safeguarding polies and procedures are reviewed and updated. All staff have safeguarding training each year, including Prevent training and online safety training.
